Have you ever wondered why our churches always ask you to pray for missionaries and pastors but rarely ask you to pray for engineers, lawyers, taxi drivers, bankers, etc.? Somehow, we came up with the idea that some professions are more spiritual than others. Of course, introducing people to Jesus and thus helping them to receive eternal life is the noblest of all tasks. But this does not mean that any other activities are not spiritual or cannot produce eternal results.

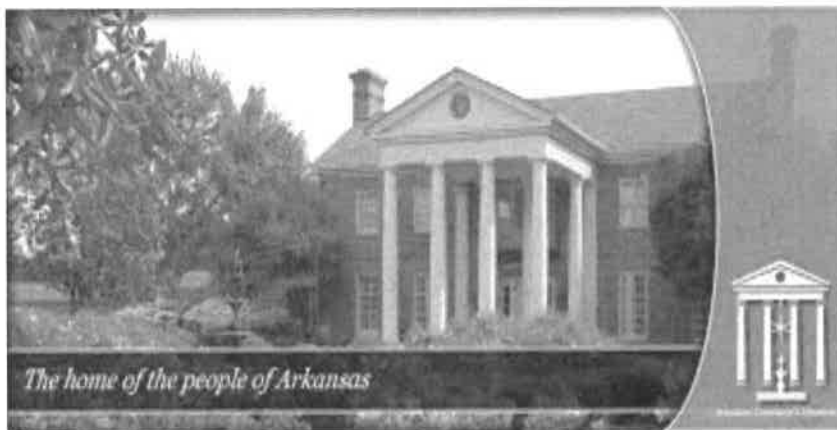
Paul says that our bodies are the temple of the Spirit. This is more than saying that we should not sin because God lives in us. It means more than that. This is an affirmation that what we do with our bodies – our labor, our craftsmanship, our care for others – is an extension of Christ's body. What you do at the office is no more or less spiritual than what you do at church or at home. There are no secular pursuits for a Christian.

You may say that your job is so mundane – you spend all day typing numbers on a computer screen, or receiving money and giving change as a cashier. Think of ways your Father in heaven can be glorified by what you do. Perhaps He can be glorified by the way you respond to pressures on your job. Perhaps by the distinct way you treat your clients. Perhaps by the peace, listening ears, joy, encouragement you bring to your coworkers. Perhaps by the Christian ethics you show in your dealings at your company. Perhaps by using the income you get to generously bless others.

Your job – even as a part-time post-retirement job or informal responsibility with your grandkids – is not to be developed apart from your responsibility and privilege to glorify God. The challenge is to discover the link. As Mike Pettengill, a missionary in Honduras says, "The call to missions has more to do with the condition of our heart than it does with the location of our feet."

Make this your prayer today: *Lord, help me to find out ways I can lift you up through my job. Give me open eyes to the needs of those I encounter, be they co-workers or clients. Help me be your hands, your ears, your feet, your mind to serve them. Show me ways I can use the gifts and opportunities you give me to make this a better city. Give me the privilege to help people have a better opinion about You because they met one of your children. Amen.*

Levy Baptist Church gave \$19,055.31 to the Cooperative Program between January 24, 2017 and June 30, 2017. In this same time period, we gave \$4,142.14 to Lottie Moon and \$3,133.25 to Annie Armstrong, for a total missions giving of \$26,330.70 in the first 6 months of 2017.

Right here in Arkansas, our Cooperative Program giving helped start 15 new churches that baptized 65 people. 2,855 students attended Super Summer Arkansas with over 450 total decisions.

ABSC Disaster Relief volunteers responded to 7 disasters and made 822 ministry contacts with 18 professions of faith.

7 Medical/Dental clinics served 431 patients and had 32 professions of faith.

258 were provided care through the seven residential ministries of Arkansas Baptist Children's Homes.

Camp Siloam registered over 5,000 campers and had 985 total decisions.

Our giving also helped enable over 9,900 missionaries to be

actively sharing the Gospel worldwide, seeing people come to Christ even in regions that have never before seen converts.

Together, through our missions giving, Southern Baptists are taking Jesus to a lost world!

Levy Baptist Church currently has 19 households that have signed up for Kroger Community Rewards. These households led to Levy Baptist Youth receiving a check for \$53.98 for purchases made between 5-1-2017 and 7-31-2017.

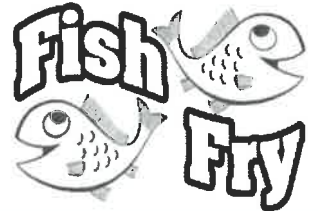

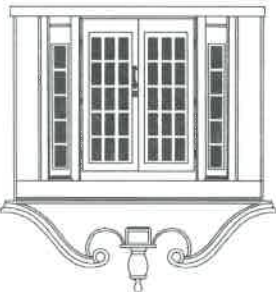
