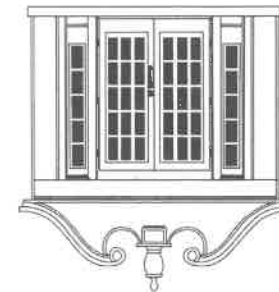

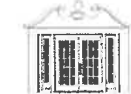

Tua Tagovailoa won the College Football National Championship for Alabama when he launched a 41-yard touchdown pass to Devonte Smith in overtime. That play made the score 26 to 23 and lifted the Crimson Tide over Georgia. The game and Tua's performance will rise to legend status in the lore of college athletics. Yet Tua's greater victory occurred when he used the platform of winning the big game to deliver a powerful testimony for Christ. In the post-game interviews, the 19 year old from Hawaii naturally declared, *"First and foremost, I'd like to thank my Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. With Him all things are possible. That's what happened tonight...all glory goes to God. I can't describe what He has done for me and my family."*

Tua was born and raised in Hawaii and is a vocal Christ-follower. His uncle served as his pastor and he attended church every time the doors were open. As Tua grew up, his parents led the family in evening devotionals that concluded with the singing of a Samoan hymn which promised to make God the central feature of their daily lives. The Tagovailoa's raised a champion for Christ who is now quick to elevate the name of Jesus and share the Savior's love and light with an attentive world.

Tua's bold proclamation of the gospel reminds each of us that God calls His Children to seize every opportunity to share our faith. Your platform may not be a national championship, but creatively endeavor to use your place to lift high the name of Jesus.

The Apostle Paul explained that his primary purpose in life was to share the transforming truth about Christ. From the public square of Athens to the prison cell of Philippi, Paul consistently and creatively seized every opportunity to share the love and light of Jesus. Paul provided his motive by stating, *"For I am not ashamed of the gospel for it is the power of God unto salvation for the Jew first and also to the Greek."* (Romans 1:16) Paul echoed the central teaching of Jesus who declares, *"I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, no man cometh unto the Father but by Me."* (John 14:6) Jesus is the only way to find eternal life. All other ways are dead ends. The only path to heaven is by faithing and following Jesus. Therefore, it is imperative that we share Jesus with our perishing world and urge people to receive Jesus into their hearts. Start with your friends and family. Simply tell them what Christ has done for you. Carry a gospel tract with you and let the people you meet receive the seeds of God's Word as you lovingly convey the most important message on the planet.

My Friends, let's use Paul and Tua to propel us to utilize our God-given platforms to elevate Jesus and His invitation to follow the world's singular Savior and find eternal life!

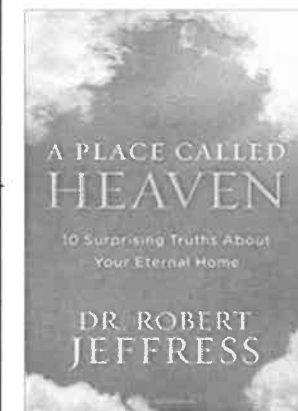
